The three-hour session begins at 6 pm on **Thursday, November 9, 2017** at the Art Gallery of Guelph, 358 Gordon St, Guelph, and includes a panel discussion, concurrent break-out sessions for visual artists and musicians, and networking. The break-out sessions will be led by Carmen Spada (music), and John Kissick and Barbara Hobot (visual arts). The session is presented in association with the *Guelph Young Artist Mentorship Project*, a GAC/SOFAM partnership that is made possible with support from the **Ontario150 Partnership Program**.
