## **Guelph's new online Arts Hub launched**

**Guelph, ON** – July 29, 2021 – Guelph Arts Council's new website, still found at our online home [guelpharts.ca](http://guelpharts.ca), offers new and improved online services for members, organizations, and the Guelph-Wellington community. Arts Hub visitors can access an arts and culture events calendar, read arts news articles, discover program offerings, find resources, and browse a member directory, within a site with a revamped look and integrated accessibility tools.

The site also hosts new features. The **online store** is an exciting addition that allows the Guelph-Wellington community to connect with and support local artists. Guelpharts.ca serves as a central online location for members of Guelph's arts community to showcase their work, and for community members to browse and shop local artwork, music, books, and more.

Guelph's Arts Hub also features an **events calendar** that promotes local cultural events: exhibitions, concerts, performances, screenings, readings, tours, festivals, workshops, and more. GAC members can promote their events through the calendar and anyone browsing the site can find events to attend.

For those in search of resources, the new website provides a **digital resource library** to serve professional development, space and venue, arts education, funding, and other resource needs. The site also includes **opportunities** in the cultural sector: job postings, calls for submission, and volunteer roles.

GAC's membership includes artists and organizations from many creative disciplines. To help showcase their work, the new site features a filterable **Member Directory**, complete with member profiles. This feature is helpful for anyone looking to connect with specific types of artists to book performances, commission works, or learn artistic practices.

Both artist and organizational members can now access and update their member profiles to include bios; photo, video, and audio examples of work; and links to social media. GAC offers a training package and one-on-one assistance as needed so members can get started on the new site.

GAC invites new members, including established and emerging individual artists and groups, to join. Membership is accessible to all on a pick-your-price basis. We extend a special invitation to BIPOC, LGBTQ2S+, newcomer, youth, low-income, d/Deaf artists, and artists with disabilities to get involved. Membership information is posted [here](#).
